## **DEPARTMENT 2 & 3**

### **DAIRY CATTLE & BEEF CATTLE**

#### **SPECIAL INFORMATION:**

1. General Rules and Health Rules (refer to table of contents) also apply. Application must be received three weeks prior to the fair and mailed to the address indicated in the General rules and on the entry form. Registered name and number, with sire, and dam's name must accompany entry. A copy of Certificate of Registration to insure eligibility in any class must be submitted.
2. All exhibitors must have health charts containing TB testing and shipping fever inoculations before animals are considered for unloading/
3. Health charts, physical conditions, and alterations will be checked by appointed committee; and until said requirements are approved, the animals will not be unloaded.
4. Exhibitors must have all animals for entry in 4H Show on grounds before 3PM or after 10PM on Tuesday. **NO ANIMALS MAY BE BROUGHT IN BETWEEN 3P AND 10PM.** Exhibitors must have all animals for entry in Open Show on grounds before 5 AM Wednesday.
5. Exhibitors of livestock will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendent and to accept the stall assigned without controversy; to keep their animals in an attractive appearance, and to cooperate with Department 2 & 3 officials in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show. When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under the alter and in charge of owner or owners representative.
6. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the judging schedule, Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competing.
7. The exhibitor will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and to remove all their equipment promptly as the Superintendent may direct. No clipping animals inside the barn.
8. Decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by animals at shows shall be prohibited until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judge.
9. Ropes must be provided by exhibitors to tie animals to tie rails.

10. Exhibitors must furnish their own roughage and grain, No silage will be fed to animals, No hay is to be stored in the exhibit area. No equipment is to be stored behind animals; no feeding of animals will be permitted during shows.
11. Milking equipment will be available for use by the exhibitors courtesy of Art noble, Honesdale, and the Greene-Dreher-Sterling Fair.
12. If there are any problems, complaints, suggestions, etc..., please contact the Superintendent or a member of the Livestock Committee.
13. A merit award of \$10 per exhibitor will be given if no other premiums are awarded.
14. `Exhibitor must agree with SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS (refer to table of contents) and sign the verification on the reverse side of the entry form.
15. Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for shoe. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. If you are not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat or dairy animals do not use it! **\*\*Important\*\*** If upon slaughter treatment with drugs, biologics, o any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and nay other damages will be bone by the exhibitor.
